

WORK SESSION

ATTENDANCE:

Pamela Bossart, Louis Giavasis, Albert Leno, II, Claude W. Shriver, II, Mark Cozy, Joe Iacino, Michelle Mahoney, John Sabo, Mary Lee Sponseller.

President Giavasis convened the work session at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Joe Underwood, the Stark County Subdivision Engineer, was present to discuss with the nine residents that were present, the proposed drainage plan for the new Glen Oak High School. Most of the residents resided on Hollydale NE. Mr. Underwood explained, using maps, the areas of present flooding, and also the natural area for a detention basin, which exists on the property. He said that they would then be within their storm sewer, be going from a 48-inch pipe and throttle it down to a 24-inch pipe to reduce the mass. Mr. Underwood stated that the school would certainly work with all of the people and help them work out any drainage concerns that they presently have. He did feel that actually this plan would probably improve the drainage problems that they are having presently. He also discussed sanitary sewer and said that they should go through the Stark County Sanitary Sewer personnel, and that a petition would be needed. Mr. Underwood then drew a graph showing the flow rate of water over time, and explained how this works and how a retention basin would be a valuable asset to not only their existing problem, but to the drainage situation when the new high school is completed.

Mr. Leno asked that they talk about the Sweetwater allotment again. He said that the easements have been done and Mr. Underwood said that he will be getting the costs together to correct the problem. It will probably be corrected by putting in a swale. Mr. Leno also noted that he had talked to Mrs. Vignos, the Stark County Commissioner, who said that funding had been set aside to go forward in a partnership with Plain Township to correct this problem.

SHERIFF'S REPORT:

C. J. Stantz was present, as well as Deputy Haines and Deputy Maskaluk. There were complaints registered through the office again about basketball hoops in the right-of-way. Mr. Cozy explained that, in particular, one lady who took hers down after receiving a letter from Mr. Iacino was complaining that other people in her neighborhood had them up. Mr. Williams addressed the idea of a possible home rule resolution with specific language to putting things in the right-of-way. This way there could be fines levied to the offender. Mr. Leno mentioned several things that children play in the street: kick the can, football, frisbee. Mr. Williams said that none of these particular actions require putting something in the right-of-way. The Board will listen to more details regarding possible language and a home rule resolution from Mr. Williams in the future.

Mrs. Bossart wanted to point out to the Sheriff's Department that there had been personal trash dumped at the yard waste site and the person that dumped it actually had some of their mail with their address in it. Detective Stantz is following up on this.

4. Ohio Department of Transportation - regarding the noise barrier along 62 and 77, explaining that it would be constructed north of Croydon only and they would also be replacing the existing fence.
5. Donna Miller-Stasiokowski – regarding snow removal. She said that there are three of the same sign in a cul-de-sac.

CONCERNS OF CITIZENS:

Ann Lewis, of Werner Church Road, wanted to know if the Board was aware that they are drilling an oil well in Saratoga Hills. Mr. Cozy said that someone else had called him and he had given them the proper numbers to call to check this out.

Fred Rossetti, of Mt. Pleasant Road, said that he was here to represent Pebblebrook Allotment, and they wanted to know why they do not have handicapped sidewalks in the allotment. Mr. Williams explained that if this would fall under the Americans With Disabilities Act, the allotment may have been put in before that and most probably it was not required at that time. Also, Mr. Rossetti said that some residents asked why they have no municipal swimming pool in the township. Mr. Giavasis told him to check with North Canton to see what the costs were in maintaining a swimming pool, and it's a losing proposition.
