John Rambacher, of 6039 Beverly NE, spoke in favor of the change. He said that this would be composed of 16 residential units having an association to maintain all of the outside areas, including the streets and yards. It would have Stark County sewer and water, which is all readily accessible, run to the units. Mr. Giavasis wanted to know if there are any plans for drainage. Mr. Rambacher said that the drainage would flow its natural course, which presently goes into the Reemsnyder Ditch. Mrs. Bossart said this is the first time any change was asked without any covenants or anything for her to look at. Mr. Giavasis said that if we change it to R-3, and the property were sold, they could build apartment buildings. The Law Director pointed out that, as it is presently zoned commercial, this would be less aggressive zoning. Mrs. Bossart said that she is going to watch the project very closely, and is concerned that some of the residents might have water or flooding problems. Mr. Giavasis said that he also is going to watch it very closely. He is not comfortable at all in going ahead and making the change without seeing the plans. However, Mr. Rambacher did say that he would have to meet all of the standards set by Regional Planning and Stark County Regional Development.
