With the sounds of Spring knocking at our door, the Plain Township Zoning Department would like to pass along a few friendly reminders to all property owners, both residential and commercial:

Permits Required

Before you begin any construction project, you will need to contact the Zoning Department to discuss the minimum setbacks and maximum size requirements that apply to your property. In addition to a permit application, a site plan drawn to scale of your property is required to illustrate the new construction's size and location on the property. Permits must be issued BEFORE any work begins!

If you are hiring a contractor, we recommend that you discuss who will be responsible for the permits. Remember that, ultimately, the property owner is responsible for compliance of his/her property with all Plain Township zoning requirements.

For general information regarding the minimum requirements, application procedures, and fees required for your project, please contact the Zoning Department at 330-492-4686.

Certificate of Conformance

This is to all commercial property owners and potential tenants: A Certificate of Conformance Permit is required <u>prior</u> to anyone occupying a building in a Business, Office, or Industrial District.

A <u>NEW</u> permit is required for changes in:

- * Business Use
- * Ownership
- * Tenant(s)

Complaint Procedure

With the spring and summer seasons upon us, the Plain Township Zoning Department has been receiving numerous nuisance complaints; for the most part, due to high grass and/or weeds. The Zoning Department has the following policy regarding the filing and investigation of complaints for zoning violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health and/or safety:

- * Complaints will be taken in person, in writing, or by telephone;
- Complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner;
- * A response will be forwarded to identifiable complainants regarding the conditions found and intended course of action following initial investigation of the complaint.
- * Anonymous complaints will be taken, but are not prioritized and will be investigated when there is time available for such.

ORC Section 505.87 authorizes the Board of Trustees to provide for the abatement, control, or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse, and other debris from land in the Township, if the Board determines that the owner's maintenance of such vegetation, garbage, refuse, or debris constitutes a nuisance.

Sign Permits

Almost any temporary sign will require a Sign Permit, so before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your Sign Permit from the Plain Township Zoning Department.

A Temporary Sign Permit is active for 30 days. You may display a temporary sign for two months out of a six-month time period. Please apply for and obtain your Temporary Sign Permit <u>before</u> placing it outside of your business.

ALL PERMANENT SIGNS REQUIRE PERMITS!

Home Rule Resolutions

In 1991, Plain Township became a home rule township. The home rule designation allows the Township to exercise limited powers of self-government and limited police powers.

Plain Township has several home rule resolutions on various subjects, including animal regulations, park rules, and obstructions in the right-of-way.

All home rule resolutions are enforced by the Stark County Sheriff's Office, 330-430-3800.

Spring Maintenance

The road crew will be sweeping all Township streets beginning the second week of March, if weather allows. Yard repairs from snow plow damage will begin in early April (weather permitting) in the order that the requests were received. Asphalt curb repair will be done during the summer. If you see a pot hole on a Township road, please call the Plain Township Road Department at 330-492-3423. Repairs will be made as soon as we are aware of the obstruction.

Permits Required

Permits can be obtained by coming to the Road Department which is located at 6300 Heminger Avenue.

Road Opening Permits:

A permit is required for any excavation in the Township right-of-way. The fee for this permit is \$50.00.

Driveway Permits:

A permit is required for new construction or any other improvements you make to your existing driveway. This permit gives you instructions for paving and apron requirements. The fee for this permit is \$10.00.

Prevent Drainage Problems

You can help prevent drainage problems by remembering not to blow or rake leaves, grass clippings, or other debris into the storm sewers, ditches, or streets, as this is not only in violation of ORC 3767.17, but it will also help to reduce many drainage and flooding problems during heavy rain falls!

Please also remember that it is illegal to dump oil, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides, or other hazardous products into ditches. culverts, or catch basins. All violators will be prosecuted! If you see dumping taking place. please report it to the Stark County Health Department by calling 330-493-9904.

Trees, Bushes, & Hedges

Please trim back your trees, bushes, hedges, etc. that cause sight problems for drivers. The courts have determined that there may be a joint liability between the owner and the governmental agency hazards in the right-of-way. the

> Township is NOT responsible for trees in the right-of-way!

Hoops & Garbage Cans

Portable and permanent basketball hoops are very popular throughout Plain Township. Please remember that no basketball hoops or garbage cans are permitted to be placed in the right-of-way. The Plain Township Trustees ask that these hoops be moved immedi-

Micro Surfacing

In 2007, the Township used a new method called micro surfacing to help reduce the cost of paving roads. This new pavement resurfacing procedure extends the life of a road up to eight years! The Township micro surfaced and crack sealed 0.65 miles of road in the northwest end of the Township on 39th Street, 40th Street, and Brookdale.

2008 Paving List

The 2008 Paving list was not yet completed at the time of printing of this publication. The list will be posted on our website at www.plaintownship.com when it has been finalized.

2007 Year-End Road Report

During 2007, the road crew completed 4,537 work order requests for services such as patching, street sweeping, catch basin repairs, curb repairs, drainage, roadside mowing, snow plowing, and deicing of Township roads.

The Plain Township Road Department also completed the following:

- * Paved 10.16 miles of road;
- * Repaired and power boxed with 313.5 tons of asphalt;
- * Repaired/replaced 4,752 feet of concrete curb and gutter; * Cleaned 99 catch basins;
- * Installed/repaired 1,466 feet of asphalt curb;
- * Striped 22,860 miles of center line and 39.32 of edge;
- * Crack sealed a total of 5.23 miles of roadway;
- * Vactored 44,600 feet ditch line;
- * Flushed/cleaned 11,319 feet pipe;
- * Installed/repaired 6,946 ft. of culvert pipe;
- * Reconstructed 2,200 feet of ditches;
- * Swept 338 miles of road.
