Please be advised that the Canton Marathon will be hosting an event on Sunday, June 17, 2012. This event will include a 10K race, 13-mile half-marathon, five-person marathon relay and a 26-mile full marathon. #### **Home Septic Systems**

In January 2012, the Stark County Health Department updated regulations regarding home septic systems which utilize aerobic treatment units (aerators). homeowners with an aerobic treatment unit are required to have a current service contract and maintain a contract for the life of the system. Aerobic systems are highly mechanical. Continual maintenance of these types of systems is vital for proper wastewater treatment. #### **Electric Aggregate Program**

Recently, an opt-out letter was sent to eligible residents and small businesses of Plain Township, specifying the terms and conditions of a new governmental aggregation offer. Residential customers in the program will receive 10 percent off AEP Ohio's generation rate and small business customers will receive 8 percent off AEP Ohio's generation rate through their March 2015 meter read dates.

Plain Township voters approved governmental aggregation in November 2011.

#### Do You Rent Your Home?

If you are renting your home, you DO need renter's insurance!

Statistics show that nine out of ten renters do not have renter's insurance. Most people think that they won't need it. Yet there are more fires in rented homes and apartments than owner-occupied structures. The risk increases even more in an apartment building because there are more families in one building than in a single-family home.

Renter's insurance is inexpensive. The average annual premium is between \$130 - \$150 for \$20,000 worth of coverage, and usually includes personal liability.

Don't risk losing everything in a fire without coverage. We have seen too many people lose everything they have. Not having insurance makes the loss even worse. We strongly recommend you get renter's insurance right away.

#### **Zoning Complaint Procedure**

With the spring and summer seasons upon us, the Plain Township Zoning Department has been receiving numerous nuisance complaints, mainly due to high grass and weeds. The Zoning Department has the following policy regarding the filing and investigation of violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health or safety:

- Complaints will be taken in person, in writing or by telephone.
- Complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner.
- A response will be forwarded to identifiable complainants regarding the conditions found and the intended course of action, following initial investigation of the complaint.
- Anonymous complaints will be taken, but are not prioritized, and will only be investigated when all regularly scheduled work has been completed and there is additional time available within the department.

Complaints regarding high grass or weeds must be at least eight inches in length and must cover 50 percent of the land or more.

ORC Section 505.87 authorizes the Board of Trustees to provide for the abatement, control or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris from land in the township if the board determines that the owner's maintenance of such constitutes a nuisance.

Our Zoning Classifications of Properties list is also available online. This is a zoning classification list of all township properties that you can search by address or parcel number to find out how a particular property is zoned. We strive to have the most accurate information possible; this list will be updated as changes occur.

The list of Plain Township businesses will be coming soon! This will be the most current list of all businesses in Plain Township that have obtained their Certificate of Conformance Permit. This list will be updated monthly. If your business name is on the list and you wish to have your website and/or email address listed, contact

Stephanie at <a href="mailto:smetzger@plaintownship.com">smetzger@plaintownship.com</a>. If your business name is not on the list, please fill out a Certificate of Conformance application and obtain your permit.

#### **Zoning Certificate of Conformance**

To all commercial property owners and potential tenants: A Certificate of Conformance Permit is required prior to anyone occupying a building in a Business, Office or Industrial District.

A new permit is required for any change in business use, ownership or tenant. Applications can be picked up at the Plain Township Zoning Department during regular office hours.

#### **Zoning Permits Required**

Before you begin any construction project, your first step should be to contact the Plain Township Zoning Department to discuss the minimum setbacks and maximum size requirements that apply to your property.

In addition to a permit application, a site plan drawn to scale of your property is required to illustrate size and location of the new construction. *Permits must be issued before the work begins*.

If you are hiring a contractor, the Zoning Department recommends that you discuss who will be responsible for obtaining permits with your contractor. Remember that, ultimately, the property owner is responsible for compliance of his or her property with all zoning requirements.

#### **Sign Permits**

Almost any temporary sign requires a sign permit, so before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your sign permit from the Zoning Department.

A Temporary Sign Permit is good for thirty days. You may display a temporary sign for two months out of a six-month time period. Please apply for and obtain your Temporary Sign Permit *before* placing it outside of your business.

All permanent signs require a permit! Please check with the Plain Township Zoning Department for size regulations.

## **Road Department**

#### **Spring Maintenance**

The road crew will be sweeping all township streets beginning the second week of March, if weather allows. Yard repairs from snowplow damage will begin in early April in the order that the requests were received. Asphalt repair will be done during the summer.

#### 2011 Year End Report

During 2011, the road crew completed 3,295 work order requests for services such as patching, street sweeping, catch basin repairs, curb repairs, drainage, roadside mowing, snow plowing and deicing of township roads.

The Plain Township Road Department also completed the followina:

- Paved 11.42 miles of road.
- Repaired and power-boxed township roads, using 858 tons of asphalt.
- Repaired/replaced 1,695 feet of concrete curb and autter.
- ♦ Installed/repaired 2,020 feet of asphalt curb.
- Striped 22.32 miles of center line and 40.44 of edge line.
- Crack-sealed a total of 4.83 miles of roadway.
- ♦ Vactored 73,690 feet of ditch line.
- ♦ Flushed/cleaned 4,098 feet of pipe.
- Cleaned 215 catch basins.
- ♦ Installed/repaired 3,499 feet of culvert pipe.
- Installed/repaired 146 catch basins.

- Reconstructed 1,510 feet of roadside ditches.
- Swept 525 curb miles of road.

You can help prevent drainage problems by remembering not to blow or rake leaves, grass clippings or other debris into

the storm sewers, ditches or streets. This is not only a violation of ORC 3767.17, but it will also help to reduce many drainage and flooding problems during heavy rainfalls.

Please also remember that it is illegal to dump oil, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides or other hazardous products into ditches, culverts or catch basins. violators will be prosecuted! If you see dumping taking place, please report it to the Stark County Health Department at (330) 493-9904.

#### **Right-of-Way Obstructions**

Please trim back your trees, bushes, and/or hedges that may cause a sight problem for drivers. The courts have determined that there may be a joint liability between owner and the governmental agency for hazards in the right-of-way. Plain Township is not held responsible for trees in the right-of-way!

Portable and permanent basketball hoops have become very popular throughout our community. Please remember that no basketball hoops or garbage cans are permitted to be placed in the right-of-way. The Plain Township Trustees request that these hoops be moved immediately.

## (330) 492-3423 **Permits Required**

A Road Opening Permit is required for any excavation in the township right-of-way. The fee for this permit is \$50.

A Driveway Permit is required for new construction or any other improvements made to an existing driveway. This permit gives you instructions for paving and apron requirements. The fee for this permit is \$10.

#### **Stormwater Marking**

We are currently seeking volunteers for the Plain Township Marking Stormwater Curb Program. We need groups of four or more such as boy scouts, girl scouts, youth groups or anyone else who may be interested.

What is stormwater curb marking? Curb marking is a coordinated effort to apply educational messages on local storm drains and basins that flow into vital bodies of water.

The purpose of curb marking storm drains is to eliminate NPS pollution. Stenciling the words "Do Not Dump, Drains To Lake" warns the community not to dump pollutants in catch basins.

Organizing a curb marking project is a very important environmental initiative that can lead to cleaner, healthier recreation and drinking water for our homes, communities and our neighbors down stream.
