


Plain Township Offers Full Concert Series at Legacy Park in 2024



Splash Pad at Veterans Park

With the end of the winter rapidly approaching, it is time to start getting outside and enjoying all of what your Plain Township Parks offer. The Splash Pad at Veterans Park, located across from GlenOak High School at 1714 Schneider St. NE, Canton, 44721, is scheduled to open Friday, May 24, 2024.

The splash pad will be operational daily from 10am - 7pm. It is open to the public at large. It displays several water features for people of all ages and abilities. All children not completely potty trained are



required to wear swim diapers for the health and safety of all users. The shelter at Veterans Park is available for reservation. The reservation of the shelter does not include exclusive use of the splash pad, but does include the pavilion, tables, grill, and trash cans within its structure. All other park amenities remain open to the public at large.

The Splash Pad at Veterans Park will remain open through Labor Day weekend before shutting down for the season. We encourage you to spend your day at the park and enjoy the splash pad, playground, disc golf course, walking trail, dog park and the Veterans Memorial Hillside monuments dedicated to the men and women of the armed forces. We look forward to seeing you and your family at the park!

Want to Rent a Shelter? Here's How...

Shelters are one of the most popular amenities in your Plain Township Parks System. People of all ages and abilities take advantage of a beautiful park setting for their birthday and graduation parties, family reunions, wedding and baby showers and other special occasions. The shelters are a great place to gather, celebrate, and enjoy the unique amenities of each park.

All our shelters can be rented online at your convenience 24 hours a day from the comfort of your home. Visit apm.activecommunities.com/plaintownship/Home or go to plaintownshipstarkoh.gov and click the hyperlink on the homepage. You must create an account, select your desired park and shelter, along with the date, and time of your event. After you complete your online payment, you should print and

review your reservation permit. Your permit serves as your documentation that the shelter is booked during your selected date and time. Bring that permit with you to your reservation. Please include setup and tear down time into your reservation window as we allow multiple reservations per day. Your rented space needs to be cleaned and vacated by the end of your reservation time and ready for the next rental. Shelters are \$10 per hour with a \$10 nonrefundable administrative fee for residents and \$30 per hour with a \$10 nonrefundable administrative fee for nonresidents.



We have 3 beautiful outdoor shelters to select from. Al Leno Park off of Alpine Street is home to the North and South outdoor shelters. The South shelter is closest to the indoor restroom. At Veterans Park, the outdoor shelter is located near the playground and splash pad. Diamond Community Park hosts an indoor community room inside of the Diamond Indoor Sports Complex.

After renting the Diamond Park Community Room, be on the lookout for an email from someone with a township email address with instructions on how to access the room.

A Snapshot of History

During the transformation of the property at 7831 Cleveland Ave NW to Maisano's Little Italian Kitchen, a log cabin structure was found. This log cabin dates from around the 1850s and is typical of German/Swiss construction which is consistent with the demographics of the area at that time. Over the years, additions were added to include a living room, bedrooms and a porch. This is typical of how homestead structures were modified as the families' needs evolved.




This land was originally purchased in 1806 by John Bosert, is referred to as Section 6 Southeast Quarter and comprised approximately 180 acres (this was the smallest land tract you could purchase at the time.) From there the land was passed on to: Isaac Kearn – 1813; Leonard Allerman – 1831; Christian Balmer – 1832; Samuel Schrantz – 1835; Jacob Schlott – 1851; Hiram Schick – 1867; Fred and Peter Slusser – 1875 (first indication on maps of a house on this property); Abraham Stoner – 1881; Enos Holl – 1905; Ervin Shutt – 1915; C. C. Hartong – 1923; Maud Dewell – 1933; Rev. John Williams – 1959; John Bontrager – 1967; and Little Italian Kitchen – 2021.

Over the years. this area housed a fruit farm, Faulkner Auto Sales, CCC Trucking Company, the Barrel Room and storage units. An interesting note about one of the owners Rev. John Williams and his wife Geraldine Osborne, is that Geraldine was the granddaughter of Walter Malone who started the Cleveland Bible College. In 1957, the Cleveland Bible College moved to Canton and changed their name to Malone College.

If you have any additional information on this area, please let us know. Also, we are always on the lookout for photos of houses across the years so we can track how the area has changed.

Copies are still available

Our new publication is still available on a limited basis. This project has been in development for over three years and is a collaboration between Historic Ridgewood, McKinley Presidential Library and Museum and the Plain Township Historical Society. This book is an updated and fresh look at the efforts to preserve and share the history of the Ridgewood Neighborhood. The neighborhood was originally in Plain Township before being annexed into the City of Canton in 1919. Ridgewood is over 100 years



old and showcases houses built from 1919 thru 1990s. Even the original farmhouse from the 1860s is still standing. There are many treasures in this neighborhood from the architects and builders to the home owners who reflect the history of our area. 

Complaint Procedure

With the spring-summer season upon us, the Zoning Department will receive numerous complaints; for the most part, due to high grass and/or weeds. Last year alone, our department investigated 344 complaints. Due to the number of complaints, it is important to have the address of the property when you report the nuisance. We cannot accept the nuisance complaint without an address.

Please remember the following points regarding the filing and investigation of complaints for zoning violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health and/or safety:

- Complaints will be taken in person, in writing, or by telephone.
- Complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner.
- Anonymous complaints will be taken but are not prioritized and will only be investigated when all regularly scheduled work has been completed and there is additional time available within the Department.

ORC Section 505.87 authorizes the Board of Trustees to provide for the abatement, control, or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris from land in the Township, if the Board determines that the owner's maintenance of such vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris constitutes a nuisance.

Zoning Permits Required

Before you begin ANY construction project, your first step should be to contact the Zoning Department to discuss the minimum setbacks and maximum size requirements that apply to your property.

In addition to a permit application, a site plan of your property is required to illustrate the new construction's size and location on the property. Permits must be issued before work begins.

If you are hiring a contractor, the Zoning Department recommends that you discuss who will be responsible for obtaining permits with your contractor. Remember that ultimately, the property owner is responsible for compliance of his or her property with all Township zoning requirements.

What is a Township Fiscal Officer

The Township Fiscal Officer is an elected official and is independent of the Township Trustees, yet by law, the Township Fiscal Officer must work closely with the Trustees. While the Trustees have the legislative authority in the township (ORC 505.01), the Township Fiscal Officer must keep an accurate record of all township accounts and transactions (ORC 507.04). It is the responsibility of the Township Fiscal Officer to strictly comply with the legal requirements set for the Township Fiscal Officer's duties, to establish and practice rules for efficient management of the Township Fiscal Officer's office, and to follow good accounting practices in maintaining records and accounts.

The Township Fiscal Officer has designated duties that are specified in the Ohio Revised Code, such as recording accurately the proceedings of the Board of Township Trustees, i.e., keeping the Minutes (ORC 507.04), plus numerous other duties, including keeping the township records and being responsible for them; overseeing and safeguarding the township funds; working with the trustees to see that monies are spent wisely and in the best interest of the residents. It is a checks and balance system that generally works very well.






As we begin 2024, I wanted to take some time to inform the Plain Township community of a program that I recently implemented at the Stark County Sheriff's Office through the SPIDR Tech Company. As your Sheriff, continuous improvement and transparency are significant priorities for me. The SPIDR Tech company helps us all in both of those areas. For those residents that have called us over the past couple of months, you may have experienced some of what this program is about. Most people who place a call for service with the Stark County Sheriff's Office will receive a communication from our office that is generated by the SPIDR Tech program in the form of a text message. Residents can expect to get updates that their call was received and further updates when a deputy is dispatched to address their issue. We know that your time is valuable and this communication is important. Out of safety concerns for both residents and deputies, there are a few types of serious calls that do not receive these messages. Sometimes, the element of surprise is important in our line of work.

An additional valuable tool associated with this new program is the ability to send a survey to evaluate our deputies' service. About twenty-fours hours after the call for service is completed, residents can expect to receive an additional message with a link to complete a brief survey. The goal of the survey is to help us assess the performance and professionalism of our deputies and communication technicians. While only a few short questions, we take the results seriously and carefully review all of the responses. The information gathered is valuable and fits within the goals of greater transparency and continuous improvement. The community input has already helped us identify areas that we can do better. So far, the results have helped us provide better information to the public with our response and also helped us address ways we can improve communication with our residents. I have the utmost confidence in the professionalism, integrity and courage of the men and women who work at the Stark County Sheriffís Office to serve your community. This technology has additional features that we hope to roll out in the future that will benefit the Plain Township community. 2023 Year End Report

During 2023, the Road crew completed 6,728 work order requests for services such as paving, street sweeping, catch basin repairs, curb & gutter repair/replacement, drainage, vactoring, snowplowing, and deicing of township roads. The Road Department completed the following work:

Spring Maintenance

STREET SWEEPING

The Road Department will begin its annual street sweeping program in late March or early April, weather permitting. Both road sweepers take 5-8 weeks to sweep all 350 lane miles and cul-de-sacs throughout Plain Township. In 2023, the road crew removed 255.25 tons of debris off the roadway and hauled it to an approved dumpsite.

PLOW DAMAGE

The Road Department crews will begin yard repairs in March. Our repairs consist of screened topsoil, seed & starter fertilizer. If your lawn was damaged during a plow event and needs repaired, please contact the Road Department at 330-492-3423.

PERMITS REQUIRED

Permits can be obtained and paid for on the Plain Township website under the Road Department section or at the Road Department office, located at 6300 Heminger Ct. N.E.

- Right-of-Way, Road Cut- Any excavation in the township right-of-way: \$75.00 fee
- New construction or any other improvements to existing driveway: \$20.00 fee

PREVENT DRAINAGE PROBLEMS

You can help prevent drainage problems by not blowing or raking leaves, grass clippings, or other debris into the storm sewers, ditches, or streets. Also, by helping keep catch basins clean, we can work together to reduce drainage and flooding issues during heavy



Please also remember that it is illegal to dump oil, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides, or other hazardous products into ditches, culverts, or catch basins. All violators will be prosecuted! If you see dumping taking place, please report it to the Stark County Health Department by calling 330-493-9904.

Spring showers bring May flowers and overgrown trees and bushes!

Please trim back your trees, bushes and hedges that may cause sight obstructions for drivers. The township is NOT held responsible for trees in the right-of-way!

HOOPS

Portable and permanent basketball hoops are very popular throughout Plain Township. Please remember that no basketball hoops are permitted to be placed in the right-ofway. The Plain Township Road Department asks that these hoops be moved immediately

EQUIPMENT UPGRADE



Last fall we had the opportunity to make a much-needed upgrade to our fleet. Our 1999 Tandem Dump Truck was replaced with a 2011 International Tandem Dump Truck with 41,000 miles. It was purchased from Pike Township for \$75,000. A new Tandem would cost well over \$300,000 and have a 3-year lead time.

Yard Waste Recycling

The Plain Township Yard Waste drop-off site opens for the season on Friday, March 1st, 2024. The site is open from 8am until 8pm every Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. This amenity is for residents only. You must be a resident of Plain Township regardless of the school district you reside in.

The site requires a key card issued by the Township. Only one key card per residential household in the unincorporated area of the Township will be issued. To obtain a key card, residents may register on-line by going to www.plaintownshipstarkoh.gov and click on the Yard Waste Link on the home page. A credit card and email address are required to complete registration successfully.



The key card expires one year from the date of purchase. If you registered on-line using your credit card and that credit card is still active, it will automatically renew on that date. NOTHING FURTHER IS REQUIRED.

If your credit card information has changed, please call (330) 492-4689 to update your information. DO NOT register again as this creates a duplicate record in our system. If you registered in person and paid by cash or check, you will need to come in to renew your card on or before your expiration date. Do not dispose of your key card. You will keep the same card regardless of how you registered.

Residents who do not have access to a computer may register at the Plain Township Administrative Office between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm. If registering at the Plain Township Administrative Office, please bring a check or exact cash payment as we do not have change available.

The Plain Township Board of Trustees is happy to provide this service to our residents and grateful for the partnership with Earth-n-Wood who pick up the yard waste!

Remember, only rain should go down the storm drain!

Plain Township is part of the P.I.P.E committee. P.I.P.E. stands for Public Involvement/Public Education. This committee consists of representatives from the cities, villages, townships, and county. This committee meets 3-4 times a year to review and coordinate the stormwater program. We share ideas, themes, activities, and costs to promote a consistent message throughout the county regarding stormwater. This year's stormwater theme is "It's Not Too Hard to Clean Up Your Yard." Storm drains lead directly to local waters. They are not filtered or treated and pollutants that enter our storm drains end up in the water we drink, fish, and swim in. Lawn care chemicals often end up washing into our local waters. You can make your lawn care stormwater friendly by following these tips:

- Fertilize sparingly. If you fertilize more than once, don't fertilize in the spring until
 you have mowed the lawn three times.
- More is not better. Skip the "step programs" and apply fertilizers and pesticides as directed. No more than one to two pounds of nitrogen per 1000 square feet.
- Avoid using fertilizers and pesticides within 75 feet of waterways.
- Mow high and leave grass clippings on the lawn. It improves your lawn's health and quality.
