Renewal of License Plates

Did you know that part of the fee you pay for license plates is returned to the tax district you live in? That is why it is always important to look closely at your Certificate of Registration for your vehicles and make sure that if you live in Plain Township, the tax district on your registration reflects that.

All of the funds that are received from the license plate registrations are used to purchase road salt for the maintenance of your roads in the winter. Plain Township also receives part of the gasoline tax from sales at gas stations within the township and only uses these funds for the maintenance of our roads that lead us safely to work, school and home each day.

This is another good reason to shop local and make sure the money you are spending will come back to help out the community that we call home.

- *An annual weekend outing for adult burn patients who have been treated at the Akron Regional Burn Center.

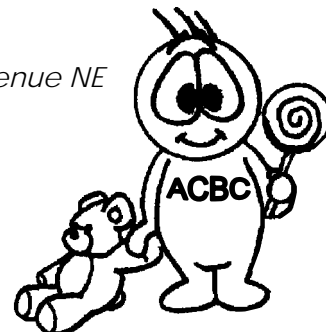

Recent Changes to State of Ohio Open Burning Regulations

Plain Township is classified as a "restricted area" by the Ohio EPA. In addition, open burning is also governed by the Ohio Fire Code, the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and Department of Forestry. There have been some recent changes related to these various codes concerning recreational fires.

A *recreational fire* is "a fire for the purpose of cooking food for human consumption, pleasure, warmth, recreational or similar purposes" if all conditions in the code are met. Generally, recreational fires must have a pile size of no larger than three feet in diameter, two feet high and must be no less than 25 feet from any structure. The materials utilized must be clean, dry wood only and shall not be utilized for waste disposal purposes. The fire must be attended at all times and a method of extinguishing the fire must be present. You must also register your recreational fire with the Plain Township Fire Department.

Additionally, no longer is any open burning of any kind permitted between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. during the months of March, April, May, October and November. No open burning is permitted when hazardous conditions exist, such as local wind speeds that exceed fifteen miles per hour, conditions that are too dry to burn or when atmospheric conditions are inappropriate for burning.

These regulations are set by the State of Ohio and are enforced by Plain Township. The purpose is to reduce the amount of pollutants in the air as well as adhering to fire safety practices.

Complaint Procedure

Complaints regarding high grass and/or weeds must be over eight inches and cover 50 percent or more of the land.

ORC Section 505.87 authorizes the Board of Trustees to provide for the abatement, control or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris from the land in the township. The Board of Trustees determines that the owner's maintenance of such vegetation, garbage, refuse or other debris constitutes a nuisance.

The Zoning Department has the following policy regarding the filing and investigation of complaints for zoning violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health or safety.

- ◆ Complaints will be taken in person, in writing or by telephone.
- ◆ Complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner.
- ◆ A response will be forwarded to identifiable complainants regarding the conditions found and intended course of action following initial investigation of the complaint.
- ◆ Anonymous complaints will be taken but are not prioritized and will only be investigated when all regularly scheduled work has been completed and there is additional time available within the department.

Sign Permits

Almost any temporary sign requires a sign permit. So before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your sign permit from the Zoning Department.

A temporary sign permit is good for thirty days. You may display a temporary sign for two months out of a six-month period. Please apply for and obtain your temporary sign permit *before* placing it outside of your business.

All permanent signs require permits! Please check with the Zoning Department for all size regulations.

Zoning Permits

Before you begin *any* construction project, your first step should be to contact the Zoning Department to discuss the minimum setbacks and size requirements that apply to your property.

In addition to a permit application, a site plan drawn to scale of your property is required to illustrate the new construction's size and location on the property. *Permits must be issued before the work begins.*

If you are hiring a contractor, the Zoning Department recommends that you discuss who will be responsible for obtaining permits. Remember that, ultimately, the property owner is responsible for compliance of his/her own property.

NEW ZONING FEES

Please note that on May 22, 2012, the Plain Township Board of Trustees passed a resolution to change the zoning fee schedule. There are a variety of changes and one new addition dealing with Internet Café/Skilled Games. Please be sure to check the Zoning page at www.plaintownship.com for the new fee schedule.

Certificate of Conformance

A certificate of conformance permit is required prior to anyone occupying a building in a business, office or industrial district. A new permit is required for any change in business use, change of ownership or change of tenant. You can pick up an application at the Plain Township Zoning Department.

Our Zoning Classifications of Properties list is also available online. This is a zoning classification list of all township properties that you can search by address or parcel number to find out how a particular property is zoned. We strive to have the most accurate information possible; this list will be updated as changes occur.
