The yard waste site at 2855 Easton Street is open for drop off for **Plain Township** residents only! Your original yard waste card issued at registration will continue to be the card you will utilize. **A new card will not be issued for renewal.**

If you already have a key card, please note the expiration date of your card. If you registered on-line using your credit card and that credit card is still active, it will automatically renew on that date. NO FURTHER ACTION IS REQUIRED. If your credit card information has changed, please call (330) 492-4689 to update this information. Do not register online again, as this creates a duplicate record in our system.

If you registered in-person at Township Hall and paid by CASH or CHECK, you will need to come in to renew your card either on or before your expiration date.

Replacement Cards:

Only one key card will be issued per address. In the case of a misplaced key card, there will be a \$15 replacement fee, paid in exact cash or check, for a new card. Residents must come into the office to have the new card issued. Once again, please do not reapply online.

The Yard Waste Site is open on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday from 8 am until 8 pm.

Please remember that the yard waste site is under 24-hour surveillance for your safety. Please follow all posted rules for the yard waste drop off. Illegal dumping or using the yard waste card in a manner not consistent with the rules will result in a fine and revocation of your card.

If you have not yet purchased your card, please visit plaintownship.com and click on the yard waste button. The annual fee is \$25.00.

Self-service recycling is open seven days a week, dawn to dusk, at the following locations:

- Easton Recycle Center, 2855 Easton St NE
- Saint Michael Church, 3430 St. Michael Drive, NW

Rain Gardens

During storms, water lands on lawns and hard surfaces like roofs and driveways. As water moves across these surfaces, it picks up pollutants like oils, salts, fertilizers and pet waste. The polluted water is collected into storm drains and carried into nearby streams, rivers and lakes, polluting our water and wildlife.

Rain gardens use bowl shaped landscaped designs to capture this dirty water! Rain gardens temporarily hold water and filter this dirty water to protect local waterbodies & wildlife. The Stark County Soil and Water Conservation District offers a Master Rain Gardener Certification course for only \$25.00.It is a virtual course that meets once a week for 5 weeks. Visit www.starkswcd.org and click on the education link for details!

Prevent Storm Drain Problems

Please remember not to rake leaves, grass clippings or other debris into storm sewers, ditches, or streets, as keeping them clean will help reduce drainage problems. It is illegal to dump oil, antifreeze, herbicides, pesticides or other hazardous products into ditches, culverts and catch basins. All violators will be prosecuted. If you see dumping taking place, please report it to the Stark County Health Department at (330) 493-9904.

Want to Rent a Shelter? Here's How!

Shelters are one of the most popular amenities in your Plain Township Parks System. People of all ages and abilities take advantage of a beautiful park setting for their birthday and graduation parties, family reunions, wedding and baby showers and other special occasions. The shelters are a great place to gather, celebrate, and enjoy the unique amenities of each park.

All our shelters can be **rented online at your convenience 24 hours a day from the comfort of your home.** Visit https://apm.activecommunities.com/plaintownship/Home or go to www.plaintownship.com and click the hyperlink on the homepage. You must **create an account**, select your desired park and shelter, along with the date, and time of your event. After you complete your online payment, you should print and review your reservation permit. Your permit serves as your documentation that the shelter is booked during your selected date and time. Bring that permit with you to your reservation. Please include setup and tear down time into your reservation window as we allow multiple reservations per day. Your rented space needs to be cleaned and vacated by the end of your reservation time and ready for the next rental. Shelters are \$10 per hour with a \$10 nonrefundable administrative fee for nonresidents.

We have 3 beautiful outdoor shelters to select from. Al Leno Park off Alpine Street is home to the North and South outdoor shelters. The South shelter is closest to the indoor restroom. At Veterans Park, the outdoor shelter is located near the playground and splash pad. All outdoor shelters allow for maximum of 100 people per shelter. Diamond Community Park hosts an indoor community room inside of the Diamond Indoor Sports Complex. The Diamond Community Room's max capacity is 42 people. Rentals can be reserved one year in advance of current date.

When renting the Diamond Park Community Room, be on the lookout for an email from lbeskitt@plaintownship.com containing your four-to-six-digit one time access code for entrance to the room along with instructions. We no longer issue a physical key. Our community room is operated by the Nest lock system. Your code will only grant access during the reservation time frame. Again, be sure to include your set up/clean up time in your reservation and exit on time!

SIREN

To protect the safety of officers, emergency crews and everyone on the road, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) uses the acronym SIREN:



Stay Alert - Pay attention, keep the noise level low in your car and look for more than 1 emergency vehicle approaching when you hear a siren. You may consider driving with your window cracked - that will allow you to hear emergency sirens more clearly. Also, be aware for pedestrians who may be in the crosswalk or at the edge of the roadway.



Investigate - Check your rear-view mirror and both sides of your vehicle to estimate the speed of the emergency vehicle and plan your next move. Pull off the highway safely and gradually brake to avoid losing control.



React - React quickly and calmly and scan in all directions before pulling over. Always use a turn signal and don't slam on the brakes or pull over suddenly.



Enter - Before re-entering the road, look in all directions, turn on your signal and gradually merge back into traffic.



Never - Don't stop at a place that doesn't have enough room to pull over safely and never follow or try to outrun and emergency vehicle.

Follow these helpful tips to protect the lives of the people who serve our community. Though you may see them often, it's important to pay attention and move over every time. They may be on the way to save the life of someone you love.

A Letter from Sheriff George T. Maier



I would like to take a few moments of your time to touch on a very important topic as we approach summer and the much warmer temperatures. We have already experienced some very warm days this spring season and I want to be sure to share this important warning to our community. It is **NEVER** okay to leave children or pets locked inside a vehicle, unattended, on a hot day. As we all know, the interior of a vehicle can heat up very quickly on these sunny, hot days in Ohio. That creates a very unsafe condition for helpless children or animals left in a car.


According to the National Weather Service, a child left behind in a hot car can die within ten minutes. On a sunny, 70-degree day, the temperature inside a vehicle can skyrocket to 104 degrees within a half hour. On a 90-degree day, it can reach 109 degrees in the vehicle in a mere ten minutes! These are life threatening conditions that are completely preventable. I can't stress enough how critical it is that you always take care to get your children and animals out of the car. It is never safe to leave them unattended in a vehicle but that danger increases exponentially this time of year.

To help keep your kids safe during the summer, you should **never allow them to play inside your vehicle**. Consider keeping your doors locked so that a curious child does not find themselves trapped in a vehicle in your driveway. **Do not leave a child in the car, even for what you think will be a quick trip in the store**. **If you are having a rushed day or running behind, make it a point to always double check and make sure you did not forget a child in your car.** This becomes particularly important if you have strayed from normal routines. While to many this may seem unlikely, there have been unfortunate cases where parents have forgotten a small child rode with them somewhere and they got left behind in the car. We must take any step possible to protect the most vulnerable in our society, our children!

A couple tidbits of the duties our deputies fulfill for the Plain Township community. Did you know??

Deputies assigned to Plain Township responded to over 18,000 calls for service in 2021. More than 24,000 law enforcement activities were logged by deputies working in Plain Township. This included handling almost 800 traffic crashes, nearly 3,000 traffic stops, over 7,500 business and security checks. We are here for you every day, 24/7 helping to make for a safer Plain Township and Stark County.

Be a Good Neighbor

The Plain Township Zoning Department receives numerous complaints regarding residential, commercial, and industrial properties. The most frequent residential zoning violations involve high grass and weeds, the parking of junk motor vehicles, the storage of trash and debris on a property and the lack of basic maintenance on dwellings, garages, and sheds. Please keep the following in mind:

- Mow your grass on a regular basis.
- Do not park wrecked, dismantled and/or unregistered vehicles on your property unless stored within a garage.
- Keep your exterior property clean of trash and debris.
- Do not park commercial vehicles on your property. For the benefit of police and fire safety services, clearly identify and mark your house number on the front of your home.

Complaint Procedure

With the spring-summer season upon us, the Plain Township Zoning Department has been receiving numerous nuisance complaints; for the most part, due to high grass and/or weeds. The Zoning Department has the following policy regarding the filing and investigation of complaints for zoning violations or nuisance conditions which affect public health and/or safety:

- •complaints will be taken in person, in writing, or by telephone.
- •complaints that are filed with an identifiable complainant will be immediately prioritized and dealt with in a timely manner.
- •anonymous complaints will be taken but are not prioritized and will only be investigated when all regularly scheduled work has been completed and there is additional time available within the Department.

ORC Section 505.87 authorizes the Board of Trustees to provide for the abatement, control, or removal of vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris from land in the Township, if the Board determines that the owner's maintenance of such vegetation, garbage, refuse and other debris constitutes a nuisance.

Signs/Obstructions in the Right-of-Way Are Prohibited

It is illegal to install, erect or place any sign of any nature, including a temporary sign, within the road right-of-way. Illegal signs can be removed at any time by Plain Township. Placing signs for garage sales, house sales, or business advertising on utility poles, traffic signs, or free standing in the right-of-way are prohibited by Sections 4511.74, 5547.04 and 5589.33 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The mowing cycles of the growing season are in full swing across the Township. Crews will not mow around illegally placed items and will remove the signs.

Items placed on right-of-way areas create significant delays for mowing crews and are potential hazards for mowing operators and passing motorists. Illegally placed materials along roads can create additional hazards by blocking sight distance or distracting drivers, particularly at

intersections.

Signs posted in the right-of-way will be removed and stored at the Plain Township Road Department for 14 days prior to disposal.

Ask Vinny

Resident: My neighbor has high grass. What can the township do?

Vinny: The township can get involved once the grass is 8 inches high and impacts 50% of the property. The process takes several weeks based on the Ohio Revised Code.


