Christmas Tree Safety

Carefully decorating Christmas trees can help make your holiday safer! Keep these tips in mind this year for a safe and sound holiday season:

- Always use lights listed by a testing laboratory. Larger tree lights should have some type of reflector instead of a bare bulb.
- Connect no more than three strands of push-in bulbs and a maximum of fifty screw-in bulbs.
- Always unplug tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.
- Bring outdoor electrical lights indoors after the holidays to prevent hazards and extend their life.
- Never place lit candles near tree branches.
- Keep trees alive and moist by giving them plenty of water daily. Do not purchase a tree that is dry or dropping needles.
- If you purchase an artificial tree, be sure it is labeled as "fire retardant."

Keep a watchful eye on young children around the tree.

* Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces or radiators.

Safely dispose of the tree when it begins dropping needles. Driedout trees are highly

flammable and should not be left near the house or garage.

Portable Generator Safety

The United States Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has issued the following tips for the use of portable power generators following power outages:

- NEVER use a portable generator indoors, even with ventilation. Opening doors and windows or using fans will not prevent Carbon Monoxide (CO) buildup.
- Only use a portable generator outdoors in a dry area, far away from doors, windows, or

- away from doors, windows, or vents that lead indoors.
- Install CO alarms with battery backup in your home, test them frequently, and replace dead batteries.
- Plug appliances into heavy duty, outdoor-rated extension cords and plug the cords into the generator.
- Get to fresh air right away if you feel dizzy or weak. The CO from generators can rapidly lead to full incapacitation and death.

Oil Recycling Just Makes Sense

Did You Know?

- O Just one gallon of used oil can contaminate one million gallons of water.
- O If you recycle just two gallons of used oil, it can generate enough electricity to run the average household for almost twenty-four hours. Also, used oil can be re-refined into base stock for lubricating oil.
- O Recycling used oil allows us to continue to enjoy what many of us take for granted every day—clean water.
- O Used oils can be reprocessed into fuel that can be used in furnaces for heat; or in power plants to generate electricity for homes, schools, and businesses.

Recycled used oil probably touches your life every day—without you even knowing it. We all benefit from recycling used motor oil. From augmenting our oil supplies and helping to generate heat, to protecting the environment—recycling oil just makes good sense.

ATTENTION ALL BUSINESSES IN PLAIN TOWNSHIP

Every business in Plain Township <u>must</u> register with the Zoning Department; whether new or old! Please do this as soon as possible. By May of 2008, we would like to have all of our records current.

A Certificate of Conformance Permit is required for <u>every</u> business in Plain Township. It is also required <u>prior</u> to anyone occupying a building in a Business, Office, or Industrial District. If you are a business in Plain Township, please check to make sure that you have a current Certificate of Conformance. The Zoning Department will be reviewing our records this season to make sure every business has a current and up-to-date Certificate of Conformance.

A new permit is required for any change in:

- * Business Use
- * Ownership
- * Tenant

Applications can be picked up at filled out at our office, Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM - 4:30 PM. Once the application is filled out, the Plain Township Fire Department will inspect the property. A permit will be issued once the appropriate departments have finalized all inspections. This permit costs \$40.00 and is valid for the life of the business, as long as the business use, owner, or tenant does not change.

Home Rule Resolutions

In 1991, Plain Township became a home rule township. The home rule designation allows the Township to exercise limited powers of self-government and limited police powers.

Plain Township has several home rule resolutions on various subjects, including animal regulations, park rules, and obstructions in the right-of-way.

All of these home rule resolutions can be read in their entirety on our website: www.plaintownship.com under the heading Our Township and Home Rule.

All home rule resolutions are enforced by the Stark County Sheriff's Office, (330) 430-3800.

Sign Permits

Almost any temporary sign requires a Sign Permit, so before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your Sign Permit from the Plain Township Zoning Department.

A Temporary Sign Permit is active for 30 days. You may display a temporary sign for two months out of a six-month time period. Please apply for and obtain your Temporary Sign Permit

<u>before</u> placing it outside of your business.

ALL PERMANENT SIGNS REQUIRE PERMITS!

Please check with the Plain Township Zoning Department for size regulations.

Parking Snow Ban

Please remember that no parking is allowed on the paved surface of posted streets when there is more than two inches of snow on the ground. Several Plain Township roadways will be

the ground. Several Plain Township roadways will be posted this year with "No Parking" signs. The ban will be strongly enforced! We also request that residents on non-posted streets be courteous in moving their cars so that plowing can be done in a timely manner. Thank you.

Winter Reminders

Please note the following Winter Reminders:

- ★ Please do not put trash cans in the roadway when it snows.
- * Remember to stay at least 50 feet back from salt trucks so

that your vehicle is not damaged by salt spreaders. If you are too close, your vehicle may not be visible to the driver through the

mirrors.

* Portable basketball hoops must be removed from the

Township right-of-way.

* We apologize for snow blocking driveways and cul-de -sacs; however, at times this is unavoidable.

- If snow plows knock down your mailbox, please call us. After the snowfall has ended, mailboxes will be repaired as time allows. Repairs will be made in the order the requests were received.
- * Main roads throughout the Township are salted and plowed first; then the secondary roads. Trucks are

- assigned to specific areas and no area has priority over any other.
- * If your yard or driveway apron is damaged from snowplows, please call us and your name will be put on a list for repairs in the spring.

In being in compliance with the NPDES Phase II requirements, Plain Township being a (MS4), must create a storm water management program. A total of six minimum measures are included in our Best Management Practices (BMP). Two of the practices included public education and outreach and public participation/involvement.

On Saturday, October 20, 2007, the Girl Scouts of Northeast Ohio South Region Troup #729 decided to step forward and participate and educate the public by placing "No Dumping, Drains to Waterway" stickers on over 100 catch basins in the Wellington Hills and Wellington Woods allotments. They also went door to door, handing out reading materials about storm water management. This is a very important step in keeping the streams and rivers free of pollutants.
