# **Continuing to Support Your Plain Township**

On March 6, 2012, the Plain Township Board of Trustees will be seeking a 1.5 mill road levy This will NOT be an renewal. increase in taxes. The levy will cost the owner of a \$100,000 home just \$45.91 per year, which is the same amount it currently costs. The Trustees understand the economic burdens township taxpayers are facing, but the passage of this levy is a critical component to maintaining safe streets that are in good condition for our residents.

The Road Department maintains 172 miles of roadway. Thirteen to fifteen miles of road are paved each year, which allows us to pave roads on a ten to fourteen year rotation.

The Road Department's cost of doing business and maintaining its fleet has been continuously rising. This is due to inflation and the skyrocketing costs of gasoline, crude oil, paving materials and road salt.

Well-maintained roads mean safe travel for Police, Fire and EMS vehicles and citizens. They also increase property values for citizens and businesses.

Plain Township should be very proud of our Road Department. Supporting this renewal levy will allow our community to keep the excellent service we currently have, without any additional costs to our residents.

#### **ATTENTION ALL BUSINESSES!**

Every business in Plain Township *must* register with the Zoning Department, whether new or old. Please do this as soon as possible. We must have current records in our files, or your business is in violation of the Plain Township Zoning Resolution.

A Certificate of Conformance Permit is required for *every* business in Plain Township. It is also required *prior* to anyone occupying a building in a Business, Office or Industrial District.

If you are a business in Plain Township, please check to make sure that you have a current Certificate of Conformance. The Zoning Department will be reviewing our records this season to make sure every business has a current and up-to-date Certificate of Conformance. A new permit is required for any change in business use, ownership or tenant.

Applications can be picked up and filled out in our office, Monday through Friday, during our hours 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Once the application is filled out, the Plain Township Fire Department will inspect the property. A permit will not be issued until the appropriate inspection has been finalized.

A Certificate of Conformance Permit costs \$40 and is valid for the life of the business, as long as there is no change in business use, owner or tenant.

#### **SIGN PERMITS**

Almost any temporary sign requires a sign permit, so before you put out that next banner or portable sign, make sure you have obtained your sign permit from the Zoning Department. A temporary sign permit is good for thirty days. You may display a temporary sign for two months out of a six-month time period. Please apply for and obtain your Temporary Sign Permit before placing it outside of your business. All permanent signs require permits. Please check with the Zoning Department for size regulations.

# **Parking Snow Ban**

Please remember that no parking is allowed on the paved surface of posted streets when there is more than two inches of snow on the ground. Several Plain Township roadways will be posted this year with *No Parking* signs.



#### **Winter Reminders**

- Please do not place trash cans in the roadway when it snows.
- Remember to stay at least fifty feet back from salt trucks so that your vehicle is not damaged by salt spreaders.
- We apologize for snow blocking driveways and cul-de-sacs, however sometimes this is unavoidable.
- If <u>snow plows</u> knock down your mailbox, please call us. After the snowfall has ended, repairs of mailboxes will be evaluated in the order in which they are received.
- Main roads throughout the township are salted and plowed first, then the secondary roads. Trucks are assigned to specific areas and no area has priority over any other.
- If your yard or driveway is damaged by snow plows please call us.
