Letter From The Parks Director

Reflecting on 2023, The Plain Township Parks saw continued growth in all areas of operation and made significant improvements and progress in all facets. Growth was a key word and common theme as two new parks, Legacy Park and the John A. Sabo Service Complex came online offering new amenities, services and opportunities for all. New equipment was added to continue to provide the results and level of service residents have come accustomed to enjoying. Training again was an area of focus for equipment, policy and best practices. The Plain Township Parks Department staff completed Master Gardener Certification through Stark Soil & Water. I completed the OTALA 2.0 Leadership course. My technology skills continued to expand with implementation of WhenlWork for multiple departments, the launch pad technology used to operate the electronic sign and I've begun delving into the Eventbrite software to bring online for the Legacy Park Amphitheater events.

Programming again continued to reach new heights with registrations across all leagues both indoor and outdoor and the trend looks to continue into the new year. Community Events also saw significant growth and attendance with Paws in The Park, Salute To Veterans and the newly branded Light Up At Legacy Park rounding out 2023 in spectacular fashion. The year also saw the opening of Legacy Park and its amphitheater with 6 concerts including a soft open with The Shootouts, then Brass Transit, 70's Rock Parade, AM Gold Yacht Rock, the GlenOak High School Strings, Jazz Band, and Orchestra. Children's programming in the form of Jungle Terry, free youth dance classes with Revival Dance Studio. Adult programming also opened at Legacy Park with North Canton YMCA hosting Zumba and Pilates classes on Saturday. Residents also were treated to the 720 Sidestreet Markets at the park in September and October.

With growth also comes cost. Partnerships, sponsorships and grants again played major roles in providing for that growth. The ODNR NatureWorks Grant saw the Al Leno Park Pickleball Courts/Tennis Court renovation come to fruition. The State Capital Budget Grant allowed for a new roof and other infrastructure to be done with the historic barn at Diamond Park. NRAC and Muskingum Watershed and Stark Community Foundation grants also provided for the acquisition of the Monarch Meadows property to become part of Veterans Park. The Visit Canton Destination Enhancement Grant provided for the playground at Legacy Park. The MORE Grant provided for mulch in playgrounds. ARP funds provided for water connection at Al Leno Park. Private donations and fund raising produced the POW/MIA and Purple Heart monuments at Veterans Park. ARP Funds were responsible for the construction and completion of Legacy Park and its amphitheater. Donations also provided for the POW/MIA Honor chair and even the butterfly garden at Veterans Park. Donations from the Fire Department provided for the flags and poles in the honor garden. A donation from the Tisevich Family provided for playground equipment replacement at Veteran Park. The Ohio Realtors provided for and installed a butterfly garden at Veterans Park. Sponsorships from local businesses provided for hospitality and entertainment costs for concerts at the amphitheater, as well as Paws in The Park, Light up At Legacy Park, and Salute To Veterans. Partnerships with Oakwood Square and the 720 Market, North Canton YMCA, and Revival Dance Studio provided free programming to the public.

As we move into 2024, growth continues to be on the horizon with a full slate of events at the amphitheater, programming continuing to see significant growth, grants being solicited for capital improvements, and partnerships and sponsorships, and donations continuing to help amenity, service, and programming grow. The Plain Township Parks continues to train with a focus on best practices in all facets of operation to offer the very highest level of service to our residents, clients, registrants, reservations, and partners. We continue to make Plain Township a great place to live, work and play.



John A. Sabo Service Complex

The fire station formerly known as Old 4 was renamed John A. Sabo Service Complex. The complex houses the yard waste facility, recycling center, a fire training building, a 4.18 acre parcel for use as a park, and the Parks Department headquarters.

The park is also utilized in the summer months as a parking lot for events at the amphitheater.
