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Letter from the Superintendent

I must say that 2023 was a very eventful year in Plain Township! We accomplished and grew as an entire team within all the departments. It's refreshing to see all team members rolling up their sleeves and working together to make Plain Township a proud community.

The biggest accomplishment of this year was the support and passage of our replacement road levy on November 7, 2023. With resident support, we can continue with an aggressive resurfacing program, increase our curb and gutter program, and establish a crack seal program.

We ended 2023 with a bang! We were recently awarded OPWC funding for the Orion Street project. This project is vital as it will add drainage and resurfacing to a deteriorating roadway while providing a safe, widened roadway after completion.

We set our goals high within the Road Department and strived each day to try exceed them. This year we worked on overhauling our work order system and tracking our work in more detail. This has proven to be a success as we've seen a 65% increase in work orders completed from 2022 and we're able to produce detailed reports of materials used.

I want to thank my entire team for working tirelessly through all the elements to make this year a success.

Our team buckled down in 2023 to keep our roadways and fleet maintained and safe throughout our busy seasons. The team completed 6,728 work orders which equates to over a 65% increase from 2022. Below is a detailed breakdown of work order totals.

WINTER OPERATIONS

Your Road Department is proud to keep the traveling public safely moving in the inclement weather by meticulously maintaining our roadways 24/7. Although not the worst winter on record, our 12 operators were prepared to clear the 350 lane miles and 350 cul-de-sacs at any given time. This year we were able to make some major upgrades to our snow operations in expanding our liquid storage and mixing facility, experimenting with new plow edges that will extend life and keep trucks on the road longer during storms, and increasing our liquid output on de-icing applications.

2023 ROAD RESURFACING PROJECT

The 2023 Road Resurfacing & Concrete Curb and Gutter project was a great success. The project scope included the milling and repaving of 30 township streets which equates to 10 township miles. We also replaced 3,828 feet of deteriorated curb and gutter. The Shelly Company was awarded our bid of \$1,860,117.26 and completed the project by July. With levy support, we're hopeful to continue to resurface 12-15 miles per year and continue to replace curb and gutter.







PROJECTS & TOTALS

The Plain Township Team worked diligently throughout the year on many successful projects. We completed additional concrete curb and gutter, several road repairs, installed and cleaned thousands of feet of culverts and much more. We also responded to several storm events that left roadways blocked due to downed trees.

- ➤ Installed 1,100 feet of concrete curb and gutter and used 187.25 yards of concrete
- Installed 31 aprons and used 72.2 tons of 448 asphalt
- ➤ Installed 10 laterals and used 34.7 tons of 448 asphalt
- Patched potholes using 90.16 tons of 448 asphalt and 19.09 tons of HPM mix
- Road repair paving preformed using **382.93** tons of 448 asphalt and **206.74** tons of 301 base asphalt
- Rebuilt/Replaced 119 catch basins using 2,118 blocks/bricks
- Cleaned 788 catch basins
- Cleaned 4,416 feet of culvert pipe
- ➤ Hauled 5,766.50 tons of fill dirt
- ➤ Used **548.25** tons of gravel
- Used 64 bags of Mortar Mix and 93 bags of Spec Mix Mortar
- ➤ Installed 3,284 feet of ADS culvert
- ➤ Inspected 984 feet of culvert with pipe camera
- > Used 312.50 lbs. of grass seed and 185.25 lbs. of starter fertilizer
- > Removed **26** downed trees from the roadway
- Used 147 yards of screened topsoil
- > Hauled 255.25 tons of street sweepings to approved site
- ➤ Loaded **400**-yard waste dumpsters

SIGN PROGRAM

In 2023 we led an aggressive sign replacement program. Our team completed 1,049 work orders dedicated to the replacement and repair of all regulatory and street signs throughout Plain Township. Additionally, the Board of Trustees worked with AEP for approval on removing all illegal signs posted on telephone poles in the township. Once approved, the Road Department removed the 150 posted signs and stored until proper disposal date. Below is a detailed list of sign replacement.
